WASHTENAW COUNTY, MI., February 13th, 2023 -The Washtenaw County Office of Community and Economic Development is hosting their second

annual Small Business and Procurement Fair next month on Friday, March 15th. This year's fair will connect local entrepreneurs with resources to help their business flourish. The fair is for anyone interested in entrepreneurship and will feature resources for those in any step of the business process. The event will take place in person, however, there will be virtual component for those that cannot attend in person. The in-person portion will be held at the Learning Resource Center on Washtenaw Avenue from 10 am to 4 pm on Friday, March 15th.
